3. AGENCY REPORTS AND UPDATES

3.1 Sheriff's Office

Commander Michael Manuele made the report referring to figures of May 2022
There were 1,636 calls up slightly from last year of 1,634 calls. 229 reports were made, down from last year of 236

There were 2 reports of vandalism, several disturbance calls, trespassing, burglary. Deputies now have body cams and it was reported that the Deputy who was the victim of a gunshot has now fully recovered.

3.2 CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL

Cmdr Manuele of Sheriff's office relayed CHP highlights, as CHP representative was not present: There were 24 crashes in May, 17 on the freeway, 13 with property damage, 1 injury A total of 83 crashes, 10 DUI in 2022. Fatal collisions are down 131 Citations were issued, 8 on county roads 17 citations for speeding over 100 mph

Geoff English, TCSD board member reported:

TCSD recently adopted their new budget and it is in the black.

There are still between 75-100 properties that have not complied with weed abatement . June 1 was the deadline so now abatement will be done by the city and the owners will be responsible for the cost.

There will be significant increases to the public for waste management due to changes regarding services and Calif Senate Bill 1383 regarding organic waste management.
